## **National Curriculum Requirements of Music at Key Stage 1**

- $\bullet$  use and understand staff and other musical notations KS2 D
- appreciate and understand a wide range of high-quality live and recorded music from different traditions and from great composers and musicians KS2 E
- develop an understanding of the history of music.
