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#### Message from Claire Bolderson, Chair of Gillespie Governing Board

Dear parents and carers,

We have all been impressed by, and grateful for the innovative ways the school has developed to to ensure the very best for the children, but with fewer and fewer resources. It is that commitment, together with their high quality teaching, and support from a wonderfully engaged parent community, that makes Gillespie so special.


#### **Gillespie Science Week News**


Thank you to everyone who entered for all the wonderful, creative entries to the Gillespie Science Competition for Science Week. Here are some examples of the high calibre of entries received!

#### Gillespie Science Week – Resident Scientist

On Monday, Hassan, our science lead, some Year 6 pupils and I (dressed an as entomologist) ran a Mini Beast workshop for Reception pupils. Pupils undertook the following activities: learning what an entomologist does; a caterpillar hunt and sort; viewing insects and insect parts (through microscopes); making bees and acting out pollination; making the life cycle of a butterfly; enjoying role-play with mini beast props and entomologist dolls; putting mini beast parts together; camouflaging butterflies in garden scenes and painting symmetrical butterflies. The Year 6 pupils did a great job leading and questioning the children and encouraged lots of talk.

Year 3 visited Lab\_13 and enjoyed looking in the dark tent. They were surprised at what they could not see without light. They shared their experiences of being in the dark. Next, they explored the connections between light and different surfaces. They made excellent use of scientific vocabulary to describe different materials and the reflections made when light was shone on to them. They were able to draw conclusions about how light is reflected from different surfaces.






#### Year 4 Learning
