I have been working under the direction of, and alongside, Professor Toby Cubitt and Dr Amanda Mc Crory developing and delivering science activities in Reception and Nursery classes. Reception pupils have grown cress under different conditions and have explored floating and sinking. Our aim is to engage parents/guardians and teachers in this project. Early-years science activities, with accompanying resources, have been developed and uploaded on to Tapestry.
