School communication

- Please ensure the school office always has the most up to date contact details.
- The school office frequently contacts families via our text messaging service Teachers2parents. Unfortunately our system only allows us to text <u>one parent per family</u>. We **do not** recommend you download the app as you do not receive notifications for new messages and you become responsible for checking the app for updates. Without the app you will receive messages/notification via text message.
- The school has a Twitter account. You can follow us @GillespieSchool and see regular updates of events and things happening throughout the school. Our social media policy can be found on our school website.

Medical and Dietary needs

If your child requires medication in school, this must be handed in to the office and a form completed prior to administration at school. We will contact you if medication already at school has expired. If your child has any medical information which has recently changed, please ensure the office is informed in writing/by email and this can be recorded on our system.

School meals

To ensure we can provide the kitchen with the correct number of children having a school lunch please ensure the office has been updated if your child is having a packed lunch. The latest Caterlink menu is available <u>here</u>.

Attendance Matters!

Good attendance at school is the single most important factor in ensuring that children and young people have the best opportunities in adult life. Last year we reached our school target of 96% attendance which is fantastic and we hope to achieve the same this year! The class with the best weekly attendance will be celebrated in assembly as well as having awards and prizes at the end of terms.

With this in mind we urge families to continue to support us by ensuring where possible appointments are made after school, at weekends or in the school holidays. Families are responsible for notifying the office by call or email before 9am if a child will be absent, including the reason for absence. The school will not authorise holidays in term time and will only authorise leave under exceptional circumstances for which you must apply using an 'application for leave form' obtained from the office.

The information below shows how attendance can affect your child's future progression.

Above 97%: Less than 6 days absence a year (12 sessions)

Excellent attendance! These young people will almost certainly get the best grades they can, leading to better prospects for the future. Pupils will also get into a habit of attending school which will help in the future.

95%: 10 days absence a year (20 sessions)

These pupils are likely to achieve good grades and form a habit of attending school regularly. Pupils who take a 2 week absence every year can only achieve 95% attendance.

90%: 19 days absence a year (38 sessions)

The Government classes young people in this group as "Persistent Absentees", and it will be almost impossible to keep up with work. Parents of young people in this group could also face the possibility of legal action being taken by the Local Authority.



Punctuality

School begins at 8:55am at which time the sunflower will be brought out in to the playground. Children should quickly and sensibly make their way to their classroom ready to start their morning learning. Please support your child by ensuring they have all the equipment they need for their day including bag, water bottle, instrument if applicable etc.

School Uniform

- We remind families of our school uniform policy which can be found here.
- We regularly have used uniform stalls where parents are able to help themselves to uniform for a voluntary donation to FoG.
- PE kit should consist of a sensible t-shirt and shorts/tracksuit bottoms and suitable footwear.

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Message regarding (RAAC) Reinforced Autoclaved Aerated Concrete

You may have seen recent media coverage regarding Reinforced Autoclaved Aerated Concrete (RAAC) and its use in educational settings. RAAC is a lightweight form of concrete; because it is weaker than regular concrete, concerns have been raised about its long-term durability. Department for Education (DfE) has recently changed its guidance to education settings on the management of RAAC to take a more precautionary approach and as a result areas in affected spaces will be vacated.

We wanted to inform you that we are not affected by this decision as we do not have RAAC in any of our buildings and therefore they will continue to function as normal. We understand that parents may want to understand more about the support to educational settings to manage RAAC safely. You can read more through the article published by the DfE on the Education Hub.

I hope that this offers reassurance.
