Number Day - Friday 2nd February

Next Friday we will be celebrating the annual NSPCC Number Day. This is a day where schools raise money for the NSPCC and make a real difference to the lives of vulnerable children across the UK.



To help raise some money for the NSPCC we are inviting children once again to come to school wearing an item of clothing with digits on (e.g. football shirt) or a onesie or even dressed up as a dice, ruler or calculator!

Early Years will go on a number hunt and be challenged to find numbers between 1-10 (in Nursery) & 1-20 (in reception), Year 1 children will be challenged to know simple number bonds to 10/20 and children in years 2-6 will be challenged on their times tables/division facts. Teachers will set the challenges for their classes (as they know the children best).

PE Kit requirements

We have noticed increasingly recently that many children have been wearing unsuitable clothing for PE lessons including cropped tops and unsuitable footwear/boots. The myriad colours and styles that children are attending in are beginning to resemble a fashion parade! Please can you make sensible choices. As you know, we allow children to come to school in their PE kit and not have to change in to their PE kit in order to maximise time spent exercising during PE lessons. We remind you a PE kit should consist of:


- Joggers/leggings/shorts
- T-shirt/sweatshirt
- Trainers

Please consider this advice seriously. From September 2024 we intend to implement a more formal PE kit which reflects the range of school colours in the school uniform (yellow/white/blue) to reflect the fact children are in school to learn including in their PE lessons.



We also remind you we have a set school uniform and children should be wearing <u>school uniform</u> at all other times when they do not have a PE lesson. Our school uniform guidelines are <u>here.</u>

will you help boost our stock, but you'll also be supporting the school's ongoing efforts as an Eco-School!


