- include a background
- make sure your text and images fill the page and are large enough to read and see

Safeguarding alert regarding Andrew Cope books

Schools have been made aware of a recent safeguarding issue involving several popular children's book series by Andrew Cope, including *Spy Dogs*, *Spy Cats*, and *Spy Pups*.

Some editions of these books contain a printed web address on the back cover. This link previously directed readers to the author's website. However, the domain interrupted and no longer under his control and had been taken over by a third party leading to inappropriate adult content.

The publisher, Puffin, took swift action and have paused sales and distribution of affected lines, requested the removal of books from schools, libraries and retailers. The website has also been taken down.

Gillespie has removed any books from our library whilst this is ongoing.

What parents can do:

- Check Copies at Home. Inspect any *Spy Dogs, Spy Cats*, or *Spy Pups* books for website links on the back cover. Ensure children do not attempt to visit the site.
- Reading the Stories Is Still Safe. The concern is only with the outdated web link. The stories themselves remain appropriate for children.
- Talk to Children About Online Safety. Use this opportunity to remind children not to follow web addresses in books without checking with a trusted adult first.
